Leadership and Management Childminders – Employing an assistant.



To allow your childminding business to grow, it may be that recruiting an assistant is the appropriate next step. That being said, this can be a daunting task! It is important that you take time to consider how employing a member of staff will impact on your provision – the advantages and the challenges.

The tasks below will support you in your initial thinking and the steps associated with employing an assistant.

TASK 1

Are you aware that you will need to inform Ofsted?

You must submit the required information to Ofsted using the form referenced above and be sure to read 'What happens next'.
